

# SORRENTO CAY PROHIBITED PLANTS

January, 2000

In order to create a community that is harmonious with Florida's environment, Sorrento Cay maintains a list of plants that are prohibited from use in landscaping. Some of these species are objectionable because they are invasive, exotic nuisance plants. Others are on the list because they have problems that people feel compelled to correct through the use of large amounts of pesticides. A few of these plants are listed because they grow out of scale to the houses, have surface root problems or other characteristics that make them inconsistent with the image or stewardship standards of this subdivision.
